I speak only for myself.

I am a loyal Canadian who lives in the West. I do not regard myself as a speratist. I loved my Canada, I was content with a confederation of provinces, and with our fine democratic set of laws that have served us well for over a hundred years.

If there are seperatists in Canada they are Ontario and Quebec. They are the ones that are being led by Trudeau out of traditional Canada. The moves to change confederation and to give us a new unasked for set of laws that entirely changes the nature of the Canada we loved and knew, all have been issued out of Ottawa.

It is Trudeau who is the separatist. He violently is lying to change our status quo, not requested by the people, but by manifestos, and issued from the top.
