#### GENERAL RULES AND REGULATIONS

All entries must be placed in the Secretary's hands before 6 p.m. the night previous to the Fair. An extra fee of 10 cents per entry will be charged for all late entries made on the morning of the Fair, but the Exhibitors are reminded that it is optional with the Secretary whether he accepts late entries or not.

Positively no entries can be accepted after 11 a.m. under any consideration on the morning of the Fair.

All exhibits must be at the Fair Grounds by 11 a.m. on the morning of the Fair in order that Judges and Directors may have sufficient time to perform their duties.

Admission to grounds, 50c; children free.

Cattle judging will commence at 12.30 a.m. Horse judging will commence at 2 p.m. Poultry, Dairy Products, Domestic Products, etc., will commence 11.30 a.m.

Swine and sheep will be judged immediately after cattle.

Entry fee for Horses and Cattle shall be \$1.00; Swine and Sheep shall be 50c.

Entries can be made either personally or by letter to the Secretary. Make your entries early.

Prize tickets for first prize shall be Red; second prize, Blue; and third prize, White.

- 1. Directors shall in no case become responsible for any special prize.
- Society shall in no case become responsible for any loss or damage to any animal, or article entered for competition.
- Pedigrees of registered animals must be furnished to the Secretary at time of entry and produced to judge on Fair day.
- 4. All exhibits shall remain on the grounds or in the Hall until 5 p.m. on the day of the Exhibition, or later if in case of dispute.
- 5. Mares with foal shall mean mares with foal by side, foaled in 1920.
- 6. All exhibits must be the bona fide property of the exhibitor, at least one month previous to the day of the Fair, except where the sire and dam and their progeny are exhibited.

#### RULES AND REGULATIONS-Continued

- 7. Each animal must be supplied with a secure fastening and placed on the grounds where stated by the committee.
- 7a. All horses must be broken to halter and led into ring.
- 8. No person shall act as Judge in the section in which he or she is exhibiting.
- 9. No person, other than officers of the Fair, shall be allowed near the Judges during the time of their judging, or in any manner interfering with the Judges on duty. Forfeit of all prizes shall be the penalty for infraction of this rule.
- 10. The sub-committee in charge of the particular exhibit or matter shall be arbitrators of, and shall have the power to settle disputes that may arise in regard to any exhibit, or any matter connected with the Fair, and their decision shall be final.
- 10a. Directors shall not wear badges while showing animals.
- 11. Prize money will be paid to winners by December 1st.
- 12. In case of non-sufficient prize money, it shall be paid pro-ratio.
- 13. All horses not under saddle or harness must be shown on halter.
- 14. Any exhibitor may be called upon to make a declaration that the production is his or their own property.
- 15. Judges are particularly requested not to leave the grounds until they have ascertained from the Secretary that there are not protests against the awards in the classes they have judged.
- 16. Judges will please sign and hand in their list of awards to the Secretary as soon as possible, making such recommendations as circumstances, or their experience may suggest.
- 17. In the absence of competition in any section, or if the stock or articles exhibited be of inferior quality, the Judges will award only such premiums as they think the articles are deserving of. They will exercise their discretion as to whether they will award first, second or any premium.
- 18. It does not follow that because a prize is offered for any particular animal or article, that it must be awarded, unless there is proper competition,

### RULES AND REGULATIONS—Continued or unless the exhibit is of sufficient merit to warrant the award being made. The Judges are particularly

the award being made. The Judges are particularly requested to note this fact.

- 19. Judges in making their awards are to confine themselves strictly to the classes and sections in the Prize Lists.
- · 20. Each award must be written in a plain, careful manner on the blank page opposite the number of the entries, with the name of the exhibitor.
- 21. All prize cards or ribbons which have been affixed by the Judges must be displayed upon the animal leaving the judging ring, and during the exhibition. Any infraction of this rule will incur the forfeiture of any premium awarded.
- 22. Exhibitors must be careful that entry tags are securely and conspicuously attached to their exhibits, otherwise the exhibits may not be considered in awarding the prizes.
- 23. Horses must be shown uncovered, and in such a manner as the Judges may require or allow, and if the exhibitors refuse to submit to the requirements of the Judges, their animals will be ruled out. In Roadster or Carriage classes, exhibitors must come prepared to show their horses in four wheeled vehicles, except where specially provided.
- 24. Exhibitors must ascertain from the Directors in charge of the several departments, at what hour judging will take place. Therefore no complaints of appeal based upon the statement that Judges have overlooked exhibits will be considered by the Board.
- 25. In case of protest or appeal, the sum of \$2.00 shall be deposited with the Secretary, the same to be forfeited in case the protest be not sustained. All protests may be made to the secretary in writing on the day of the Fair before the Judges leave the grounds.
- 26. All grains, roots and vegetables must be grown by the exhibitor during the year previous to exhibition.
- 27. All exhibits in fancy work, domestic, dairy produce, girls' and boys' work must be the actual work of the exhibitor, and having not previously won a prize.
- 28. Articles on exhibition shall not be handled, except by the officer having charge of the depart-

ment to which they belong, or by the Judge.

- 29. Articles for competition must not have the name of the owner attached, until the Judges are done, when the names may be written on the cards.
- 30. During the day of the Fair all management will devolve upon the executive, whose decision will be final in all matters connected with the Fiar.
- 31. In the event of any animal or articles being entered in the wrong section of its class, the Judges shall have power to disqualify the entry.
- 32. All teams hitched above the carriage class must be hitched to lumber wagons.
- 33. Exhibitors must have attendants to lead out all stock that is shown in the ring or stock will not be considered for prizes.

- 6. Calves and pigs entered for competition must have been born on or after March 15, 1920, and must be the property of the exhibitor or the exhibitor's parent or guardian.
- 7. Grade bull calves, and grade boars are not eligible to compete, and entries for same must not be accepted.
- 8. In district where beef cattle predominates the branch managers of the banks in the Fair district shall, with the Secretary of the Fair, before applications are received, decide that the prizes shall be given to calves of beef type; and in districts where dairying stock predominates they shall decide, before applications are received, that the prizes shall be given for calves of dairy type. If the management of the fair desires that there should be more prizes for the type not selected it is suggested that the additional prizes be arranged for locally.
- Exhibitors must feed and care for the animals they exhibit for at least six weeks. Whether in the case of calves the calf is fed from a pail or not makes no difference.
- 10. An application form and a certificate form are attached hereto.
- (a) The application form must be properly filled out and filed with the manager of a local bank branch at least three weeks before the date of the fair.
- (b) The certificate must be filled out and signed by the parent or guardian of the exhibitor, and filed with the Secretary of Fair not later than the day of the competition. If, however, an exhibitor fails to present his certificate on the day of the competition, he shall be allowed to compete, but any prize he may win shall be withheld until a properly filled and signed certificate is produced, and said certificate must be forthcoming within 48 hours after the holding of the competition, otherwise his prize money shall be forfeited.

#### GENERAL RULES AND REGULATIONS

All Entry Money must accompany Entries.

Positively no Entries can be accepted under any consideration on the morning of the Fair.

All Exhibits must be at the Fair Grounds by 10 a.m. on the morning of the Fair, in order that Judges and Directors may have sufficient time to perform their duties.

Admission to Grounds, 50 cents; Children 15 years and under, Free.

Entries can be made personally or by letter to the Secretary. Make your Entries early.

Prize Tickets for the First Prize shall be Red; Second, Blue, and Third Prize, White.

- 1.—Society shall in no case become responsible for any loss or damage to any animal, or article, entered for competition.
- 2.—Pedigrees of Registered Animals must be furnished to the Secretary at time of entry and produced to Judge on Fair Day if required.
- 3.—All exhibits shall remain on the grounds or in the hall until 6 p.m. on the day of the Exhibition, or later if in case of a dispute.
- 4.—Mares with foal shall mean mares with foal by side, foaled in 1923.
- 5.—All exhibits must be the bona-fide property of the exhibitor, at least one month previous to the day of the Fair.
- 6.—Each animal must be supplied with a secure fastening and placed on the grounds where stated by the Committee.
- 7.—All horses must be broken to the halter and led into the ring.
- 8.—No person shall act as Judge in the section in which he or she is exhibiting.
- 9.—No person, other than Officer of the Fair, shall be allowed near the Judges during the time of their judging, or in any manner interfering with the Judges on duty. Forfeit of all prizes shall be the penalty for infraction of this rule.
- 10.—The Sub-Committee in charge of the particular exhibit or matter shall be the arbitrators of, and shall have the power to settle disputes that may arise in regard to any exhibt, or any matter connected with the Fair, and their decisions shall be final.
- 11.—Prize money will be paid to winners on the day of the Fair if possible and not later than December 1st, 1923.
- 12.—In case of non-sufficient prize money, it shall be paid pro-ratio.
- 13.—All horses not under saddle or harness must be shown on halter.
- 14.—Any exhibitor may be called upon to make a declaration that the production is his or their own property.

15.—Judges are particularly requested not to leave the grounds until they have ascertained from the Secretary that there are no protests against the awards in the classes they have judged.

16.—Judges will please sign and hand in their list of awards to the Secretary as soon as possible, making such recommendations as circumstances or their experience may suggest.

17.—In the absence of competition in any section, or if the stock or articles exhibited be of inferior quality, the Judges will only award such premiums as they think the articles are deserving of. They will exercise their discretion as to whether they will award first, second or any premium.

18.—It does not follow because a prize is offered for any particular animal or article that it must be awarded, unless there is proper competition, or unless the exhibit is of sufficient merit to warrant the awards being made. The Judges are particularly requested to note the fact.

19.—Judges in making their awards are to confine themselves strictly to their classes or sections in the Prize List.

20.—Each award must be written in a plain, careful manner on the blank page opposite the number of the entry.

21.—All prize cards or ribbons that have been affixed by the Judges must be displayed upon the animal leaving the judging ring, and during the Exhibition. Any infraction of this rule will incur the forfeiture of any premium awarded.

22.—Exhibitors must be careful that entry tags are securely and conspicuously attached to their exhibits, otherwise the exhibits may not be considered in awarding the prizes.

23.—Horses must be shown uncovered, and in such a manner as the Judges may require or allow, and if the exhibitors refuse to submit to the requirements of the Judges, their animals will be ruled out. In Roadster or Carriage classes, exhibitors must come prepared to show their horses in four-wheeled vehicles, except where specially provided.

24.—Exhibitors must ascertain from the Directors in charge of the several Departments at what hour judging will take place. Therefore no complaints of appeal based upon the statement that the Judges have overlooked exhibits will be considered by the Board.

25.—In case of protest or appeal, the sum of \$2.00 shall be deposited with the Secretary, the same to be forfeited in case the protest be not sustained. All protests must be made to the Secretary in writing on the day of the Fair before the Judges leave the grounds.

26.—All Grains in Sheaf, Grasses, Roots, Vegetables and Fruits must be grown by the exhibitor

during the year of the Exhibition.

27.—All Threshed Grain must be grown by the exhibitor during the year of or during the preceding year of the Exhibition.

#### GENERAL RULES AND REGULATIONS

All Entry Money must accompany Entries.

Positively no Entries can be accepted under any consideration on the morning of the Fair.

All Exhibits must be at the Fair Grounds by 10 a.m. on the morning of the Fair, in order that Judges and Directors may have sufficient time to perform their duties.

Admission to Grounds, 50 cents; Children 15 years and under, Free.

Entries can be made personally or by letter to the Secretary. Make your Entries early.

Prize Tickets for the First Prize shall be Red; Second, Blue; and Third Prize, White.

1.—Society shall in no case become responsible for any loss or damage to any animal, or article, entered for competition.

2.—Pedigrees of Registered Animals must be furnished to the Secretary at time of entry and produced to Judge on Fair Day if required.

3.—All exhibits shall remain on the grounds or in the hall until 6 p.m. on the day of the Exhibition, or later if in case of a dispute.

4.—Mares with foal shall mean mares with foal by side, foaled in 1924.

5.—All exhibits must be the bona-fide property of the exhibitor, at least one month previous to the day of the Fair.

6.—Each animal must be supplied with a secure fastening and placed on the grounds where stated by the Committee.

7.—All horses must be broken to the halter and led into the ring.

8.—No person shall act as Judge in the section in which he or she is exhibiting.

9.—No person, other than Officer of the Fair, shall be allowed near the Judges during the time of their judging, or in any manner interfering with the Judges on duty. Forfeit of all prizes shall be the penalty for infraction of this rule.

10.—The Sub-Committee in charge of the particular exhibit or matter shall be the arbitrators of, and shall have the power to settle disputes that may arise in regard to any exhibit, or any matter connected with the Fair, and their decisions shall be final.

11.—Prize money will be paid to winners on the day of the Fair if possible and not later than December 1st, 1924.

12.—In case of non-sufficient prize money, it shall be paid pro-ratio.

13.—All horses not under saddle or harness must be shown on halter.

14.—Any exhibitor may be called upon to make a declaration that the production is his or their own property.

- 15.—Judges are particularly requested not to leave the grounds until they have ascertained from the Secretary that there are no protests against the awards in the classes they have judged.
- 16.—Judges will please sign and hand in their list of awards to the Secretary as soon as possible, making such recommendations as circumstances or their experience may suggest.
- 17.—In the absence of competition in any section, or if the stock or articles exhibited be of inferior quality, the Judges will only award such premiums as they think the articles are deserving of. They will exercise their discretion as to whether they will award first, second or any premium.
- 18.—It does not follow because a prize is offered for any particular animal or article that it must be awarded, unless there is proper competition, or unless the exhibit is of sufficient merit to warrant the awards being made. The Judges are particularly requested to note the fact.
- 19.—Judges in making their awards are to confine themselves strictly to their classes or sections in the Prize List.
- 20.—Each award must be written in a plain, careful manner on the blank page opposite the number of the entry.
- 21.—All prize cards or ribbons that have been affixed by the Judges must be displayed upon the animal leaving the judging ring, and during the Exhibition. Any infraction of this rule will incur the forfeiture of any premium awarded.
- 22.—Exhibitors must be careful that entry tags are securely and conspicuously attached to their exhibits, otherwise the exhibits may not be considered in awarding the prizes.
- 23.—Horses must be shown uncovered, and in such a manner as the Judges may require or allow, and if the exhibitors refuse to submit to the requirements of the Judges, their animals will be ruled out. In Roadster or Carriage Classes, exhibitors must come prepared to show their horses in four-wheeled vehicles, except where specially provided.
- 24.—Exhibitors must ascertain from the Directors in charge of the several Departments at what hour judging will take place. Therefore no complaints of appeal based upon the statement that the Judges have overlooked exhibits will be considered by the Board.
- 25.—In case of protest or appeal, the sum of \$2.00 shall be deposited with the Secretary, the same to be forfeited in case the protest be not sustained. All protests must be made to the Secretary in writing on the day of the Fair before the Judges leave the grounds.
