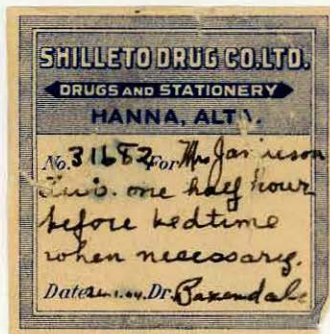

TO OBTAIN SPECIAL GRADE, cream should not be over four days old as a general rule. A churning of sweet cream, all six days old, would not make a Special Grade Butter.
