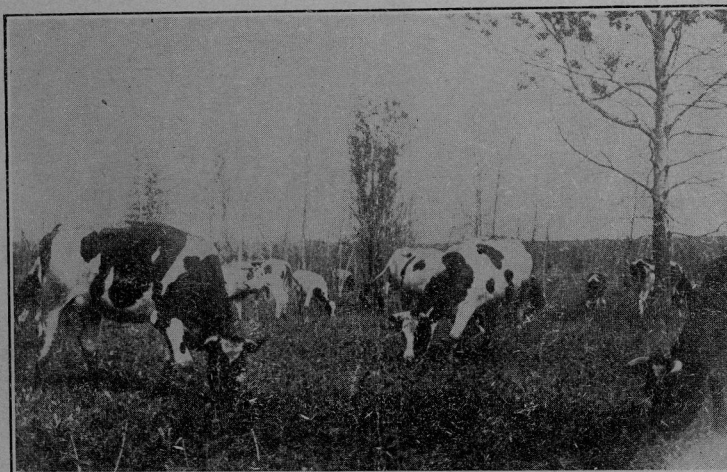

RULES AND REGULATIONS

ENTRIES

1. All entries are open to members of the Association.
2. Entries close on August 25th at 12 o'clock a. m.
3. Those requiring accommodation for exhibits should make their entries as soon as possible.
4. In all classes where certificates of registration are required, the same be produced to the Secretary when making entry.
5. All entries must be made on printed forms supplied for that purpose, the proper information given, signed by the exhibitor and sent to the Secretary on or before the 25th day of August at 12 o'clock noon.
6. The entrance fee, and membership fee, if not previously paid, must in all cases be forwarded with the entry. No entry will be accepted unless this is done. Fees should be sent by accepted cheque or bill in registered letter at the risk of the owner.
7. For each exhibit a tag will be furnished the exhibitor specifying the class and the number of the entry which tag must remain attached to the exhibit during the exhibition.
8. In all cases entries must be made in the name of a bona-fide member.
9. No animal or article may compete in more than one class or section of a class except in herd prizes in the class to which they belong, and any special prize offered. Brood mares, however, may be exhibited in harness in the class to which they belong.
10. The entry fee shall be a sum equal to 5 per cent. of the total prize in each section in all classes except Children's work, Specials and Poultry.
11. Entrance fee to the grounds shall be 25c. for those over 18 years of age. Those holding membership tickets of the Association to be admitted free, including family.

LIVE STOCK

12. All animals must be on the grounds and in position not later than 12 o'clock on the 25th of August.

13. No animal shall be removed from the grounds before 4 o'clock on the last day of the exhibition.

14. Accommodation will be provided on the grounds for live stock, straw for bedding and water will be provided for horses, cattle, sheep and swine without charge so that the stock may be taken to the grounds on the evening of August 24th if the exhibitor so desires. Hay and grain for horses, cattle, sheep and swine will be on sale on the grounds at reasonable prices.

15. Each exhibitor must be the bona-fide owner of the exhibit for at least 20 days before the Fair. Satisfactory proof of ownership of exhibit must be produced if so required.

16. In all cases of live stock where registration is called for in the prize list every exhibitor must produce to the Judges a certificate, if required, except in cases of animals under one year old. In the latter case satisfactory proof of their eligibility for registration must be produced.

17. Judging of all live stock will commence at 1 o'clock on August 25th.

18. In the absence of competition in any class, or if the stock exhibited be of inferior quality, the Judges may award only such prizes at their discretion, whether first, second or third or any premium. It does not follow that because a prize is offered for any particular animal that it will be awarded unless there is a proper competition, or unless the exhibit is really of sufficient merit to warrant the award being made.

19. No person shall be permitted in the Horse and Cattle rings during the time of judging except the Judges or assistants, persons in charge of animals, Directors of the Association and members of the Press.

20. Upon the discovery of any fraud, deception or any dishonest practice either in preparation, ownership or

other representation concerning any animal exhibited which may have effected or may have been intended to affect the decision of the Judges, the Board of Directors shall have power to withhold the payment of any prize awarded.

POULTRY AND PET STOCK

21. All specimens must be banded. This rule will be strictly enforced.

22. All entries must be made by class, and entry number corresponding to prize list on blanks provided by the Secretary.

23. All specimens must be exhibited in their natural condition with the exception of Pit Game and Game Bantam. Any violation of this rule will exclude the specimens from competing and cause the withholding of all premiums awarded to such birds. Any exhibitor interfering with the plumage or otherwise handling any bird or birds, either his or any exhibitor's during the exhibition shall forfeit the whole amount of his prize money. In the event of any owner considering it necessary that his bird or birds should be handled, then he shall report to the Director in charge.

24. The Director in charge has power to reject and remove from the space provided on the grounds for poultry and pet stock, any bird suffering from any contagious disease.

25. The Revised American Standard of Perfection shall be the guide to the Judges on all varieties mentioned in the prize list.

26. All birds will be shown as single cock, hen, cockerel and pullet. The Directors shall have the power to create a special prize for any exhibit not herein classified where the specimens exhibited are deemed worthy of a prize.

27. The Association will not be responsible for loss from any cause whatever but will, nevertheless, exercise all reasonable vigilance in the care of specimens.

28. A bird may be entered in proper section, also in Special and Farmers' classes.

29. The entry fee shall be 25c. for each bird except where otherwise stated.

30. Other regulations under heading of "Miscellaneous" applicable to this class shall apply.

MISCELLANEOUS

31. In the absence of competition in any class in exhibits other than live stock rule 18 shall still apply.

32. Upon the discovery of any fraud, deception or other dishonest practice in the preparation, ownership or other representation concerning any article exhibited which may have affected, or may have been intended to affect the decision of the Judges, the Board of Directors shall have power to withhold payment of any prize awarded.

33. All protests shall be made in writing, must state plainly the cause of the complaint and shall be delivered to the Secretary not later than one hour after the Judge's decision. The sum of \$5.00 shall be deposited with the Secretary in each case of protest, the same to be forfeited if the protest is not sustained.

34. No person shall be allowed to enter for competition more than one article in any section of a class otherwise specified or unless the additional article be of a distinct variety or pattern from the first. This does not apply to animals or poultry.

35. Special prizes are to be paid on the order of the Secretary only.

36. Where space has been awarded to any exhibitor, the Board reserves the right in case the exhibitor should fail to make or maintain a creditable display to declare the space allotted to him, or any portion thereof, forfeited. Exhibitors must arrange their exhibits in as attractive a manner as possible, and fill the space allotted to them.

37. Exhibitors must be careful that entry tags are securely and conspicuously attached to their exhibits,

otherwise the exhibit may not be considered in the awarding of the prize.

38. Every prize winner has to appear in the Grand Stock Parade which takes place at 3.30 o'clock on August 26th or at such other time as may be fixed. Otherwise he is not liable to receive his prize money, the Board of Directors to decide.

39. Enquiries as to Exhibition and its arrangements should be addressed to the Secretary, Athabasca, but any Director will in all probability be in possession of the information required.

40. The Secretary will be prepared to commence paying out prize money at 4 o'clock on August 26th. All persons to whom prizes have been awarded and who do not receive same must apply to the Secretary in writing for payment thereof on or before the 30th day of November, 1914, or such prize will be forfeited.

41. Members of the Press are cordially invited to the Exhibition.
