I raised seven children in my home enjoyed every one of them. I have been affiliated in many Women's Groups over the years Native Women's Group in Ft Smith Volunteered when ask in Childrens Clubs and Schools. Sanavikak Guild in Pine Point teaching crafts and Ceramics Mothers Auxiliary for Hockey Mothers, Legion & Royal Purple which were all Volunteer Groups. I learned lots as we exchanged knowledge with each other. Next year will have 50 years as a Royal Purple Member. I've volunteered with Youth Groups for 40 years. I joined the Athabasca Native Friendship Centre Society in 1991 was on the board

I was Vice President for 3 years as Mary Ann Swan was President then I was President for One Year and I became ill & had to step down I still Volunteer when ask. It was a busy time when Slave Lake had their Fire I was cooking every day at the Centre for three weeks my most memorable time was working with Carmella McAdam & the Youth Groups. She worked so well with the Youth and Elders we only had one lesson in Cree when they let her go. In August 2011 Peace river cancelled the Youth & Elders Gathering for one week Carmella organized one here in Athabasca. Youth & Elders Gathering Aug 16, 19 & 18 and August 23, 24, 25, 2011 I am very grateful I have had a chance to learn more about the Traditional Teachings Pipe Ceremony, Traditional Medicine & Herbs Attending Quarterly Meetings, Jasper Youth & Elders Gatherings each time I go is a learning experience for me. I hope The Elders Wisdom Circle will continue for many more years. I'm proud to be part of the Friendship Centre movement (I had the Ellis & Dougal Purple Drug Awareness Program in Athabasca Rochester & Colony Schools for 13 years) I continue to enjoy working with youth trying to get them to understand you have to be respectful to your Elders honest and continue to learn about your Culture and History and achievements of aboriginal People.
