You may be interested to know that the first International Piping Plover survey was held in 1991. Over 800 people participated in the census which resulted in the finding of nearly 5,500 adults on the North American breeding grounds. Only 180 adults were found in Alberta in 1991, down from the 288 adults counted in 1986.


